Scott Vargo gave an update on County operations. He also noted that the Colorado Department of Public Health & Environment (CDPHE) order is being clarified to make sure it is consistent with the Governor's order.

Amy Wineland gave an explanation on the importance of wearing masks in order to protect others. She noted that the County will be working with individuals to make masks, which will then be donated to the public.

Commissioner Lawrence and Mr. Vargo gave an update on other mountain communities that are not allowing short-term rentals at this time.

Mr. Vargo gave an update on a roadmap to recovery that is being drafted, which includes a proposed timeframe. He noted that the County hopes it will be available by the end of the week, when it is no longer in a draft state.

Sarah Vaine and Commissioner Lawrence noted the importance of second homeowners to our local community. They shared their concerns about making sure those individuals feel welcome when the state public health order allows for more travel.


Mr. Vargo gave an update on local traffic and noted that the traffic count at the Eisenhower-Johnson Memorial Tunnel has not gone up significantly.
