Wildfire Council Members and Partners Updates

Town of Breckenridge:

The Planning Divisions is processing a Development Permit application for the Highlands Subdivision Filings No. 1-5 Voluntary Wildfire Mitigation.

Scope: Approx. 50% tree removal in private open space along Highway 9, and 1,500-1,700 trees on approx. 60 individual lots.

Expected schedule:

May 17th Work Session at Planning Commission

June 7th Consent Agenda at Planning Commission
June 14th Town Council

USFS/DRD:

Pile burning: 120 acres burned this winter (thank you Summit Fire for the help)

Peak 7 Phase II: 96 acre treatment is expected to be completed this summer

Peabody Placer: 83 acre mechanical clearcut in the Golden Horseshoe will be done this summer-Blue River West: 122 acre mechanical and hand clearcut is expected to be done this summer

Ruby Ranch: 33 acre hand treatment in Eagles Nest Wilderness is expected to be completed this year

Shooting Range Prescribed Burn: 44 acre broadcast burn behind Summit County Shooting Range is currently going through Environmental Analysis. If approved, implementation would be this fall or (more likely) next spring.

Swan Mountain: Ongoing environmental analysis for a fuels recreation, and hydrology project in the Soda Creek/Swan Mountain area.

Frisco Backyard: Working with TOF and SE Group to develop project proposal for a fuels and recreation project.

Frisco:

Work on the North Tenmile/Frisco Water Treatment Plant Hazardous Fuels Treatment is scheduled with Rocky Mountain Youth Corps to happen this summer, starting August 8 and running through September 10. They will focus on the area north of the trail, and will work south of the trail if time allows.

The town is working with USFS to reduce fuels in the Frisco Backyard.
