Jeff Huntley provided an update on the State Public Health Order regarding bar area seating. He noted that the County Attorney's office, Public Health and the Environmental Health Department are looking into how restaurants that have tables in their bar area may operate.

Commissioners and staff discussed how restaurants may apply for license modifications through the state and the County Clerk & Recorder's office. A modification to a liquor license could allow restaurants to temporarily expand their operations into outdoor spaces such as parking lots.

Bentley Henderson gave a Transit update. He noted that routes will be resuming including commuter routes to Leadville and Park County on Monday, June 1st; Swan Mountain, Silverthorne, Summit Cove and Copper Mountain on June 8th; and full summer service on June 22nd.

Scott Vargo gave an update on state guidelines related to guided outfitter operations, which are not allowed by the state at this time. Mr. Huntley noted that licensing for these entities is controlled by the Division of Regulatory Agencies (DORA) at the state level.

Mr. Vargo provided an update on the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment's COVID-19 case numbers for Summit County as they relate to Summit County's variance application. He noted that staff have a scheduled conversation with the state to discuss the case numbers.


Amy Wineland noted that the state may give additional guidance regarding outfitters, day camps, sports leagues and pools and spas on June 1st.
