I. Recovery and Resilience Process

Commissioners and senior staff discussed various topics including but not limited to:

Scott Vargo and Dan Hendershott gave an overview of the new Safer at Home State guidelines around residential camps as well as indoor and outdoor events. Indoor and outdoor events gathering sizes will be based on the square footage of the venue or outdoor location.

Residential camps will follow the childcare and youth sports guidance that allow a maximum 25 kids for outdoor events and 10 kids for indoor events. The guidelines will go into effect on Thursday, June 18, 2020 with Tuesday and Wednesday open for feedback on these changes. The Public Health Department (PH) is supportive of the county aligning with the state changes.

Commissioners and senior team members discussed how this new guidelines would affect businesses like movie theaters, wedding ceremonies and wedding receptions as the latter two now fall under different guidelines. The group asked Mr. Hendershott to pass on their suggestions to the state.

Protect Your Neighbors is the third phase of the recovery process from the state and although not much information is available yet, it looks like each county will submit their COVID-19 data on amount of cases, contact tracing, etc., and this will determine if a county can move on to that last phase. The state has proposed to roll out this phase in late June or early July.

The Public Health Department and Summit School District (SSD) had their first kickoff meeting to discuss their plans for fall reopening. They will meet weekly and will invite The Peak School and Colorado Mountain College (CMC) to participate in some of the discussions.

II. Review of Special Requests related to Public Health Orders as well as Legal Issues related to Fire Code (Public Health Dept., Attorney)

Jeff Huntley and Scott Vargo requested an Executive Session discussion regarding various confidential legal issues related Special Requests related to Public Health Orders as well as Legal Issues related to Fire Code.

A motion was made by Commissioner Davidson and seconded by Commissioner Lawrence to go into Executive Session to review confidential public health, information, investigations, special requests related to Public Health Orders as well as Legal Issues related to Fire Code. BOCC voted 3 to 0 to go into Executive Session per CRS 24-6-402 (4) (b)(c)(d) with specific reference to 25-1-122. The motion was approved.
