**I. Recovery and Resilience Process**

Commissioners and senior staff discussed various topics including but not limited to:

Possible funds sources that can be used for future COVID-related expenses, including finding test locations for the fall and winter, as current locations will be occupied by summer's end.

Discussion of the state's 'Protect Your Neighbor' Phase 3 of the recovery process as well as the reopening of county facilities, tentatively scheduled for July 6, 2020. The county plans to open at 50% capacity, as long as physical distancing protocols can be followed. Commissioner Stiegelmeier agreed with the reopening timeframe but suggested the county keep those options like drop-off boxes to encourage the public not to come into the buildings, unless necessary.

Mr. Vargo noted that remote work would be considered for future recruiting efforts as it has worked well for many positions.

Overview of the fire code and the recent messages that went out regarding backyard campfires. The county and local fire districts held a meeting to go over the new fire code adopted this year by the county and towns, except for Montezuma, and the reasons why code changes were adopted. The planned rollout/release of the new fire code had been scheduled for March 2020 but was delayed due the COVID-19 crisis. The County will issue a press release updating the public with the fire code information.
