I. Recovery and Resilience Process

Amy Wineland gave an update on the Governor's press conference and his decision to roll back the reopening of bars due to the rise of COVID-19 cases in other states.

Ms. Wineland explained that what this means for Summit County is that bars will be closed. However, restaurants with bar areas will be allowed to stay open, but not their bar area. The goal is to avoid groups of people mingling around, and for everyone to stay at their table. Summit County's Public Health Orders are aligned with the state so if the state changes their orders, SC will follow suit.

Molly Boyd gave an update on the reopening process for county facilities. County Libraries will open in a limited capacity on July 13, 2020. County meeting spaces are only available to county staff at this time because there is not enough staff to make sure the number of attendees is not exceeded, and to clean meeting rooms between groups. Bentley Henderson and Amy Wineland also noted that most of the county's meeting spaces are not large enough to allow for physical distancing to large groups of people. Scott Vargo reiterated that meeting rooms will be the last to open.

Ms. Wineland explained how county visitors who test positive for COVID-19 while in the county, are not counted towards Summit County's numbers, even if Public Health spends a lot of time and resources on those cases. The reason is that they are outside the county's jurisdiction.


