**I. Recovery and Resilience Process**

Scott Vargo and Amy Wineland gave an update on how the SC Alert system is being used to remind the public to wear a facemask and the feedback that has been received so far. The wording of the alert will be updated as well as the time range so it is not delivered to county visitors arriving late at night. The group discussed how to avoid desensitizing the public to these alerts to the point they will ignore a wildfire alert.

Ms. Wineland reported on their follow-ups with big-box stores and the complaints received regarding large numbers of people being allowed at one time and not wearing facemasks. The Public Health Department investigated and all stores have a system in place to control the number of people they allow at one time; however, this may not be obvious when there is a large group of people congregated in one section of the store.

Amy also updated Commissioners on the issue with Centura Health being closed for testing over the holiday weekend due to lack of staff and low tests requests. Ms. Wineland assured the group that this will not happen during Labor Day Weekend. Centura has confirmed they will be open for testing seven-days a week going forward. Commissioner Lawrence asked for clarification on who

is being tested for COVID-19, and Ms. Wineland noted that the county is following the State's guidelines as to who gets tested, which is to test those living in the same household as someone who has tested positive.

Mr. Vargo gave an update on the reopening process for county facilities. For now, buildings that have been closed, will remain closed. However, a contact list will be posted so walk-ins can call a department and request an appointment.

On July 13, 2020, county libraries will partially open their doors and allow patrons to visit. and a staff member will need to let people in. County meeting facilities will remain closed at least through the end of August.

Commissioner Lawrence asked about issuing tickets or citations to Public Health Order violations, specifically in municipalities. In her opinion this would send a message to those business following guidelines that the county is paying attention and businesses not doing the same will incur penalties including fines and could also lose their liquor licenses. Jeff Huntley indicated local police handle tickets and citations in municipalities. Some of the towns will have code enforcer officers conducting spot checks on businesses, and areas that require mask wearing, to ensure compliance.


**II. Review recent COVID-19 test results and the Legal Issues related thereto (Public Health Dept., Attorney) (Executive Session Recommended).**
