Scott Vargo gave an update on the state's website, which noted that positive COVID-19 cases would be reported in the county that they were tested in, rather than where they resided. He noted that this was inaccurate, and that the state plans to fix their website. Sarah Vaine noted that Summit County would continue to do contact tracing for individuals who tested positive within the County.

Commissioners and staff discussed potential updates to the Public Health Order that would be specific to restaurants. Mr. Vargo noted that the Town of Breckenridge has voted to implement a set closing time for restaurants. He recommended that if the Commissioners would like to add it to the Public Health Order, it should reflect the Town of Breckenridge's language. Ms. Vaine noted widespread support for the change from the restaurant association. Mr. Vargo noted that a new Public Health Order would not come out until July 14th. Commissioners and staff also discussed whether the order might be modified for special events, carryout and delivery.

Mr. Vargo noted that the Family & Intercultural Resource Center (FIRC) has received significant grant funding for their food pantry from the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) rather than going through the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) reimbursement process.


Review of the ongoing Public Health COVID-19 Local Disaster Emergency and the Legal Issues related thereto (Public Health Dept., Attorney).

Jeff Huntley and Scott Vargo requested an Executive Session to discuss legal advice and related matters regarding the current state orders and Board of Health powers.

A motion was made by Commissioner Davidson and seconded by Commissioner Lawrence to go into Executive Session to review confidential public health, information, investigations, and other issues pertaining to the ongoing COVID-19 Local Disaster Emergency, and the Legal Issues related. BOCC voted 3 to 0 to go into Executive Session per CRS 24-6-402 (4) (b)(c)(d) with specific reference to 25-1-122. The motion was approved.
