Amy Wineland gave an update on the Colorado Department of Public Health & Environment's guidance for reopening schools, which will include mitigation and containment strategies. She noted that their guidance should be available in the next 24 to 48 hours.

Ms. Wineland gave an update on state summaries, including hospitalization, decreased mask wearing and increased infection rates, particularly in individuals under age 40. She noted that local intensive care units are not expected to approach capacity in the current trajectory, as long as physical distancing, aggressive contact tracing and case isolation continue. She noted that the state lab capacity will be increased by the end of the month, and noted other strategies that the state may implement to increase testing capacity.

Ms. Wineland and Sarah Vaine clarified that Summit County Public Health reports new cases to the public on Friday by noon.


Commissioners and staff discussed adding an 11 p.m. curfew for restaurants and bars allowing patrons to remain inside their buildings to the local Public Health Order. Ms. Vaine noted that the restaurant association is generally in support of having a curfew county-wide. Commissioner Lawrence voiced her support and noted that this is about protecting our workforce.

Commissioners and staff discussed the demographics of the visitors to Summit County and their exposure risk by origin. Commissioner Davidson noted that despite Summit County's successes thus far, it is not a closed system.


The meeting was adjourned.
