Scott Vargo noted that meetings with local ski areas related to operations during COVID-19 are ongoing. Amy Wineland gave an update on the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE)'s guidance for ski areas. She noted that CDPHE's current priority is providing guidance for schools, but after that guidance is finalized their focus will shift to the ski areas. Commissioner Lawrence noted that Aspen has announced that they will not have indoor dining this ski season. Commissioners and staff discussed having lodging available during the ski season to house visiting individuals in quarantine and isolation as needed.

Commissioners and staff discussed whether rapid COVID-19 testing could be prioritized for Summit County staff and students. Ms. Wineland noted that initially it will be prioritized for front line healthcare workers and hospitalized patients, but given additional capacity, that might be possible.


