Amy Wineland gave an update on Protect Our Neighbors, including the metrics needed in order to meet the criteria to apply for a variance. She noted that the only one that Summit County does not currently meet is the population testing rate. She referred to the Summit County website's COVID-19 Milestones page to illustrate the positivity rate, cases per 100,000 residents, resident hospitalization rate, and health care system occupancy and capacity. She noted that she would not recommend applying for a variance until the local schools open, to see what effect that might have on disease spread.

Scott Vargo gave an update on the upcoming county official, Colorado Association of Ski Towns, and state meeting on industry guidance. He noted that a draft of that guidance may come out as early as next week. Locally, Public Health will meet with the local ski resorts to discuss concerns about pinch points, sheltering during foul weather, potential capacity limits and reservation systems. Commissioners and staff discussed temporary shelters and flexibility in building codes on a short-term basis.


