**I. Recovery and Resilience Process**

Amy Wineland gave an update on the most recent version of Cases and Outbreaks in schools and childcare centers that was released by the state. This version is based on information from other states where school districts have already opened, and will assist Public Health and Summit School District (SSD) with the schools' reopening process.

Elisabeth Lawrence gave an update on Summit County Program Provider Collaborative (SCPPC) Group that meets weekly. The group consists of youth programming providers working on creating activity and learning programs for students from 1<sup>st</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> grades. Because they already provide youth services, they are familiar with the current rules regarding social distancing. SCPPC consists of five different groups that will manage liaison with SSD, managing logistics, fundraising, etc.

The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) has indicated they will no longer provide and pay for housing to quarantine people from high altitude locations in the fall and winter. Ms. Wineland noted Summit County's Public Health Department is working with resort areas to find ways to support people who will need to quarantine.

The state is holding conversations with counties, local governments, and the ski industry to create guidelines for the upcoming winter season. Scott Vargo noted the county is also working with ski areas to put together a plan they will share with the state to assist in their decision making process. They specifically want input from the resort areas that reopened for the summer season.


**II. Legal Advice Related to Negotiations and the Legal Issues related thereto. (Public Health Dept., Attorney) (Executive Session Recommended).**
