I. Recovery and Resilience Process

Nicole Valentine gave an update on the upcoming Town Hall virtual meeting and the topics to be discussed. These include opening plans for the ski resorts and the procedures being put in place to protect the public.

There is concern that positive cases will spike with the ski season opening COVID-19 similar to the steep increase the county had after Labor Day weekend. It has been suggested the public should consider ski areas' opening days as a holiday and follow safety protocols.

Amy Wineland discussed recommendations from the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) regarding Halloween celebrations, which include moving away from traditional trick-or-treating. Some towns are considering canceling government-sponsored Halloween events but Commissioner Stiegelmeier noted that canceling these activities could result in kids going to neighborhoods that in the past have welcomed kids, but may be hesitant to do so this year. Ms. Wineland also mentioned that Halloween-themed facemasks do not meet the requirements to stop the spread of the virus.

Jeff Huntley and Scott Vargo requested an Executive Session to discuss information related to a Confidential Public Health matter and the Legal Issues related thereto.


