

A Minnesota native who attended the Univ. of MN in the School of Forestry. Enlisted in 1953 in the Army during the Korean conflict. He learned to ski at Camp Hale CO with the 10th Mountain Division. He was employed by the US Fish and Wildlife Service for 30 years. Carl married his wife Barbara in Aug 1958, and they celebrated their 62nd wedding anniversary the day he went to be with the Lord. They have four daughters, four grandchildren and twin great granddaughters.

Carl loved the outdoors. He loved to hunt and he loved maps. He was an avid runner and skier. He was an active member in his church home—Lord of the Mountains in Dillon. Carl fought a courageous battle against melanoma for over 18 months. He will be buried at Ft. Logan Military Cemetery.


Coats & Clothing for Kids Campaign—8th Season


