

Workplace Guide: Staff Feeling Sick or Unwell Who are not Currently on Isolation or Quarantine*



If the person has any of the following symptoms, immediately call 911 and do NOT put a mask on the individual.
Difficulty breathing, chest pain, new confusion, difficulty concentrating, bluish lips or face

Assess for any COVID-19 like symptoms

CRITICAL SYMPTOM	MAJOR SYMPTOMS	MINOR SYMPTOMS
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Loss of taste or smell 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Feeling feverish, having chills, temperature of 100.4°F or greater New, worsening, or unexplained persistent cough Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sore throat Runny nose or congestion Muscle or body Aches Headache Fatigue Nausea, vomiting Diarrhea

Do you have symptoms of COVID-19?

Are symptoms consistent with an existing chronic condition or your baseline?

Employee may attend work.

Do you have new loss of taste or smell of any duration OR a Major/Minor Symptom?

1. STAY HOME!
2. [Get tested](#) for Covid-19
3. Monitor for symptoms

Do you have MAJOR SYMPTOMS or MINOR SYMPTOMS?? *If you have major and minor symptoms follow the major line.

GET TESTED FOR COVID-19 IF YOU HAVE NOT ALREADY DONE SO!
Follow [HOME ISOLATION](#) for 10 days following symptom onset AND 24 hours fever free without use of fever-reducing meds AND other symptoms are improving.

Do symptoms resolve in 24 hours?

Do symptoms resolve in 48 hours?

Employee may attend work.

What are results?*

Employee may return to work once fever free for >24 hours without use of fever-reducing meds AND other symptoms are improving.

Follow [HOME ISOLATION](#) for 10 days following symptom onset AND 24 hours fever free without use of fever-reducing meds AND other symptoms are improving.
