Note: Summit County will move right on the table (more restrictive) if hospital capacity is threatened. Summit County will not move right due to increasing incidence in general. In order to move left, metrics must meet or exceed the less restrictive Dial color for 7 consecutive days. Depending on potential future COVID-19 waves, Summit County Public Health may need to adjust the metrics to more readily address the threat of new variant infection spread.
